Dad, Grandpa & son, David Anderson, 80, passed away from complications with COVID at St. Alexius in Bismarck, ND at the age of 80 years.

David was born, May 20, 1940 in Baker, MT, to George and Mary Louise (Ramsey), the only son of four kids. David lived in Mill Iron, MT as a very young boy and later moved to Baker, MT, where he grew up with 3 sisters that loved him greatly.

While in high school David and his friend's souped-up cars to race. To which his father George didn't think that he would make it to his twenties. So, after attending high school he decided to enlist in the US Army in 1957. While in the Army he traveled to lots of different places. His favorite place was Barcelona, Spain.
