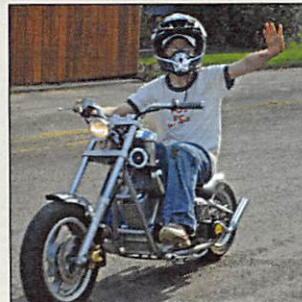

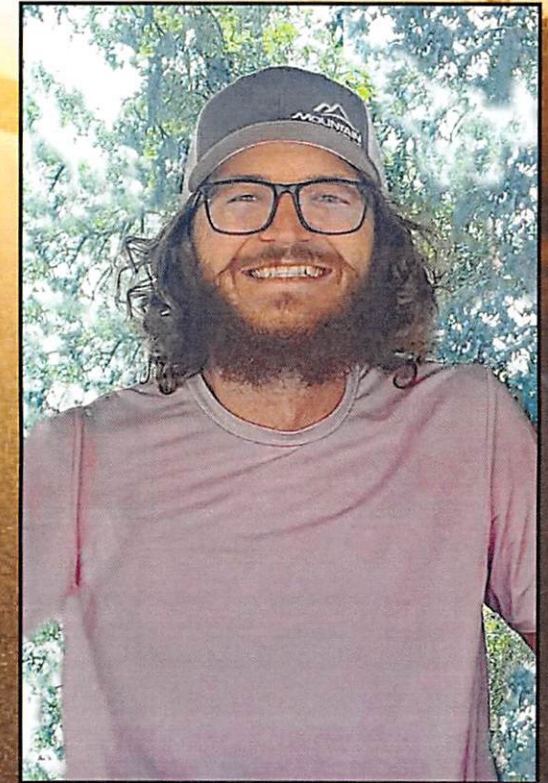

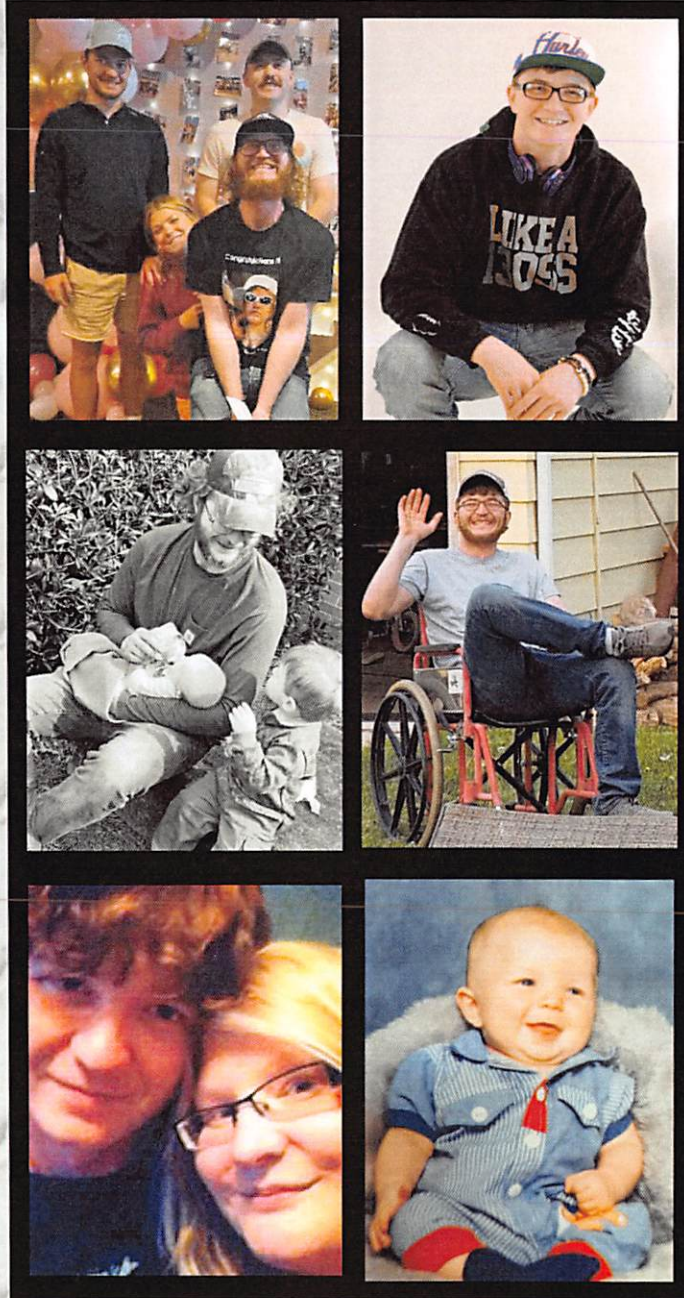
Briot was raised in Bowbells, ND until he moved to Williston in 2013.
