

He had a love for sports and attended the local Cross Country meets supporting the local runners and athletes. He also enjoyed watching Basketball, Football, and UFC. As a teenager and young adult, he loved fishing with his mother and siblings. Moreover, James loved

reading books, crafting, and sketching in his time. He enjoyed listening to rock music like AC/DC and Metallica.

James was an avid gardener and put great thought and care into our Mother Earth, fondly working with trees as a Forester and handling numerous duties in Mandan, North Dakota, for ten years. James is a loving father who had an immense love for his children, often taking them for nature walks when they lived in Idaho. He placed great importance on his Native American spirituality. James had many friends in the recovery community, providing words of encouragement to those around him.
